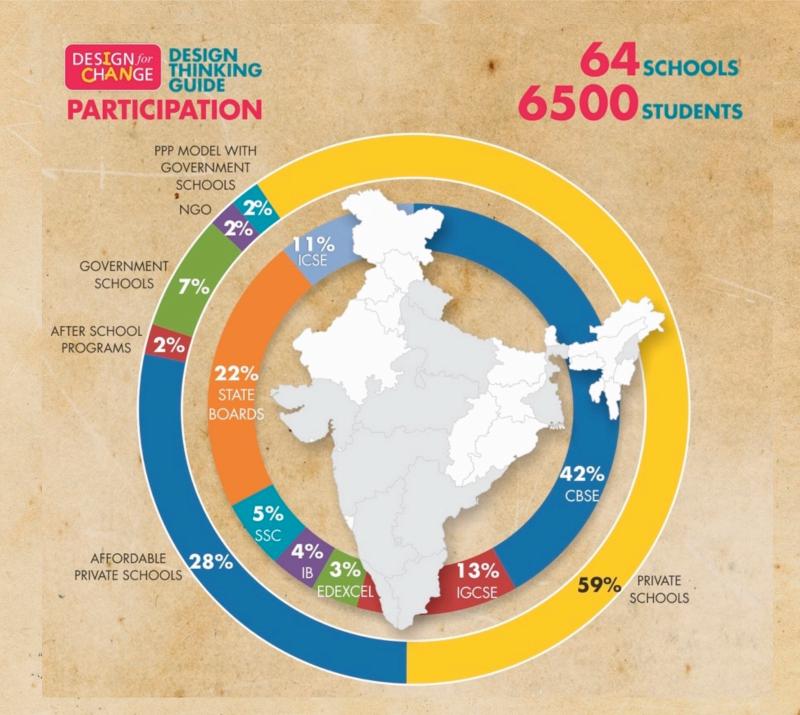

RESEARCH DESIGN

- The Good Project Team designed a pre and post assessment tool that connected specific SES traits to behaviors and measured those behaviors.
- To assess **empathetic thinking**, the students were observed for:
 - 1. Identifying problems that Affect Others,
 - 2. Thinking of situations through Multiple Perspectives,
 - 3. Designing interventions that keep the Stakeholder in the centre

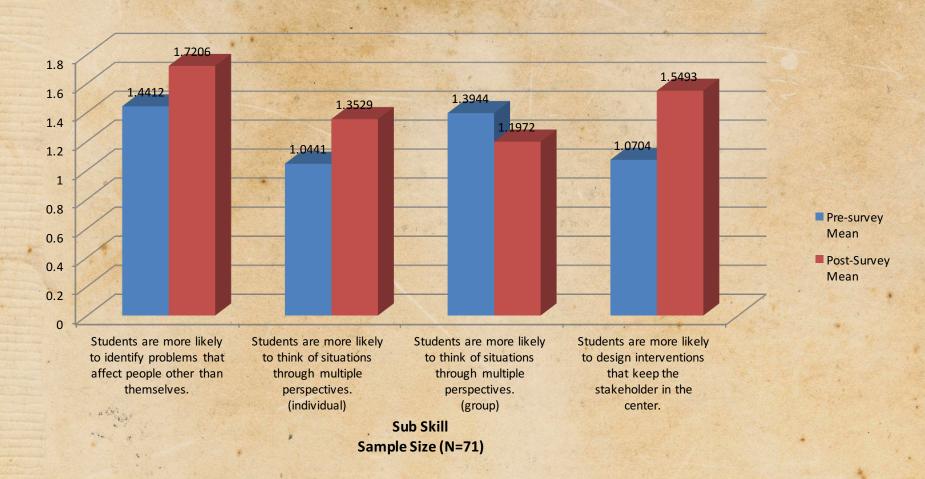

DATA ANALYSIS

Data were analyzed through a two-tailed, paired dependent T-test which showed statistically significant results for empathy and the sub-skills under it



FINDINGS

- The curriculum has been able to increase average student empathetic ability
- Under Empathy, every single sub skill showed a statistically significant change.
- Students improved in their ability to design interventions that keep the stakeholder in the center.

THE GOOD PROJECT, HGSE RECOMMENDS

• Design for Change represents a significant departure from a traditional classroom where students compete instead of cooperate and there is always a right or wrong answer – and this departure is one students should practice frequently to be equipped to contribute to 21st century society.
